## Prayers of the Faithful - First Sunday of Advent 2024

Priest: When the Lord returns, may he find us watchful in prayer. In that spirit we present our petitions, confident they will be heard.

## Reader:

For the Church throughout the world and for all who have a ministry among us: that as the Body of Christ, we may truly serve those who are in need, tread the path of peace and grow in faith and love...

Lord, hear us.

For all who are preparing in Advent for the coming of Christ: that we may find in our reading of Scripture, the Christ who is the power of God and the wisdom of God... Lord, hear us.

For peace in the world: that the Holy Spirit may lead all nations to live justly and with respect for the earth and for the rights of their neighbours...

Lord, hear us.

For those who are sick: that in the care they receive in hospital or at home they may know that the Lord is very near... Lord, hear us.

For the faithful departed: that the Lord may grant them eternal rest and comfort all who mourn... Lord, hear us.

May our Blessed Lady, Queen of Peace, take up our petitions in her prayers: Hail Mary......

The Children's Liturgy is intended to help younger parishioners to get to know the Gospel in a more appropriate format. In some parishes, it is called 'Sunday School' or 'Children's Church' and we would expect children to come along once they are in Foundation Stage or are confident attending pre-school. The lower age limit is so that children involved are used to leaving their parents, taking part in a group activity and holding a pencil. Once children are old enough to start First Communion classes, and when they have made their First Holy Communion, they will need to stay in the church to take part in the Mass and not attend the Children's Liturgy.

All of the adults who help with the Children's Liturgy are DBS checked and there are always at least two adults in the room at any point. Whilst parents might want to attend the first session or two with children, we kindly ask that they either don't attend after that, or join the Children's Liturgy rota as a leader, helper or observer, and be DBS checked.

Having a large number of unknown or unvetted adults and older children present is a **safeguarding issue**. It can also make the rooms overcrowded and less comfortable for younger children. In addition, parents and children old enough to attend First Communion should be regularly taking part in the full liturgy of Mass.

Should your child require your support during the Liturgy, we would ask you to discuss this with either Father David or Christine Burr.
