Questions relating to the future pastoral provision and mission strategy of the Diocese of East Anglia

Bishop Peter has asked all parishes to think about *Three Questions* looking at how the Diocese of East Anglia carries out the Church's mission now and over the next decade.

In the next ten years the number of priests in the Diocese is likely to significantly decrease. This means that more will need to be done to support the remaining priests and some difficult decisions will need to be taken about the total number of churches and Mass centres the Diocese can support. This is particularly challenging because the number of people coming to Mass in many parishes is, happily, growing.

Therefore, the Bishop wishes parishes to reflect on how parishioners can best support not only their parish priests but also other parishes in the Diocese who may, in the future, not have their own resident priest.

The Questions are an opportunity for us all to reflect on our parish community and both rejoice in the many blessings it already brings and to consider how we can continue to grow as a community of faith, encompassing young and old, both long term and recently welcomed parishioners and reaching out to other local churches and to the community at large.
